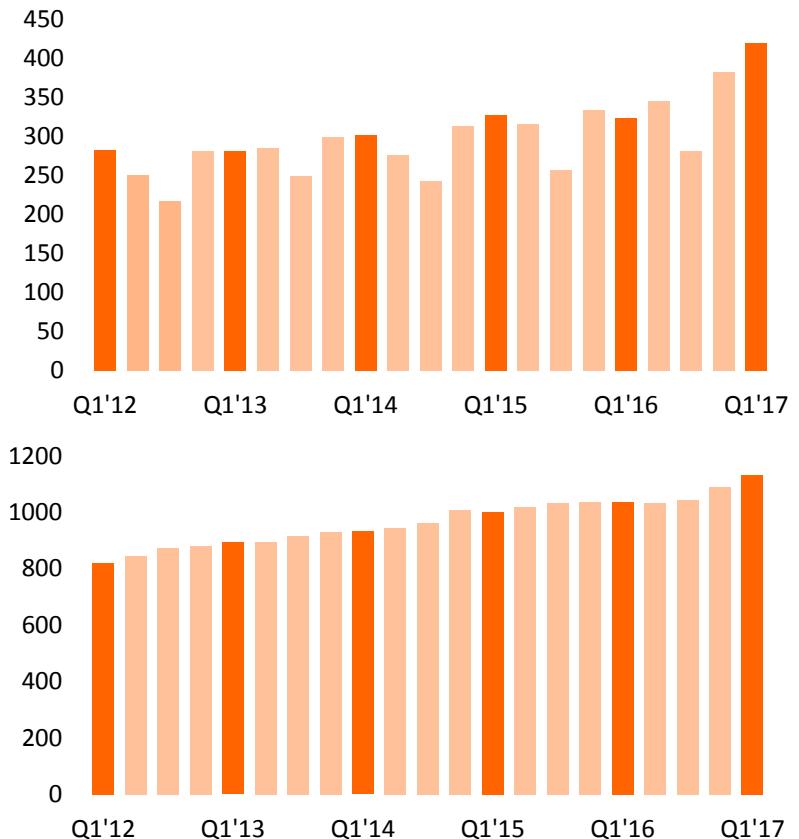

Highlights in the quarter

- Revenue and EBIT
 - Operating revenues increased by 29.8 percent to NOK 419.1 million (y-o-y)
 - EBIT increased by 102.5 percent to NOK 41.2 million (y-o-y)
- 1 131 employees
 - Up 41 from Q4'16
 - An increase of 95 in the past 12 months
- Increased demand for robotic process automation (RPA), machine learning (ML) and artificial intelligence (AI)

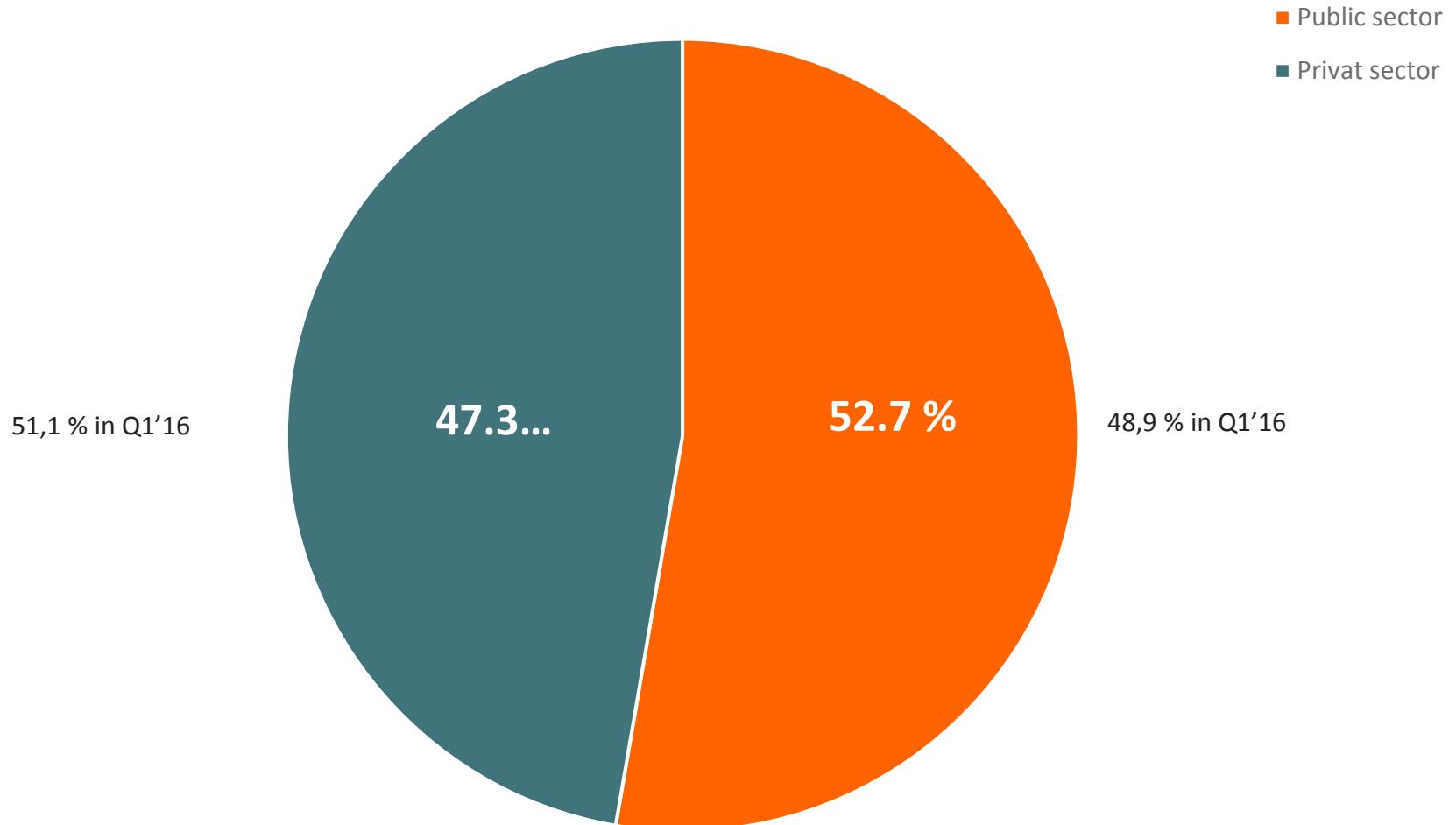
Revenue and number of employees
MNOK and number



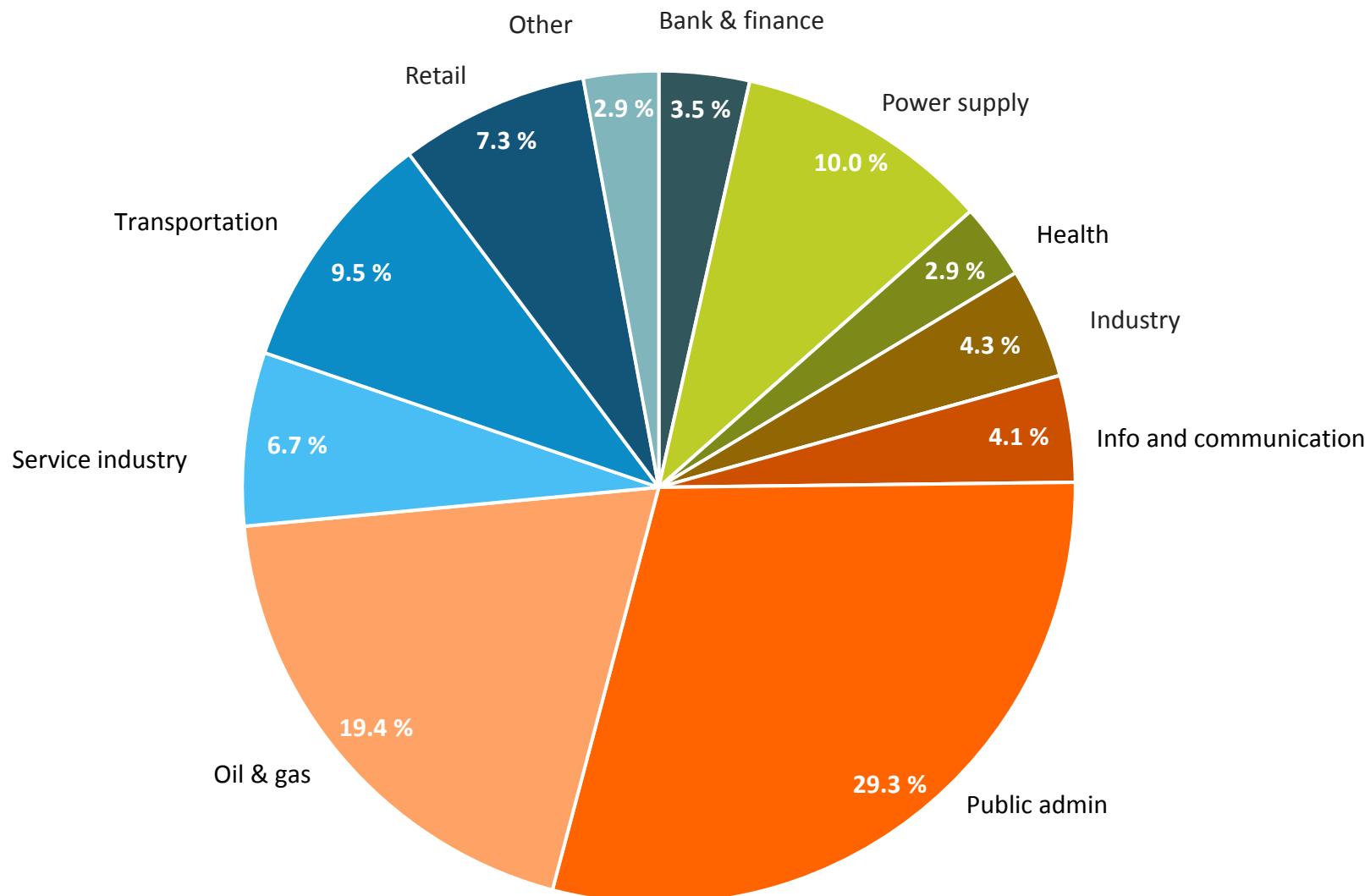

○ Power supply

- Increased by 52.9 percent (y-o-y)
- Represents 10.0 percent of total revenues in Q1'17

○ Retail

- Increased by 61.5 percent (y-o-y)
- Represents 7.3 percent of total revenues in Q1'17

○ Service Industry

- Increased by 71.7 percent (y-o-y)
- Represents 6.7 percent of total revenues in Q1'17

Det finnes tusenvis av Internett-tilkoblede leker i norske hjem. Mange av disse lekene kan enkelt hakkes og brukes til overvåking. Blant disse er docken Cayla som nylig ble kåret til årets leke.

Finn Myrstad, fagdirektør for digitale tjenester i Forbrukerrådet, forteller om docken Cayla. Den har en optaksfunksjon som lar barn snakke med dokken, for så å søke på Internett etter svar til spørsmålet.

- Det vi er bekymret for er at barnet kan oppleve dokka som et levende vesen, og derfor ha tillit dokka som gjør at barnet kan fortelle en god del ting. Og når vi vet at dokka er koblet på nett, er vi bekymret for hva som kan skje med den informasjonen, uttaler han.

De har avdekket at opptakene blir sendt til selskaper utenfor Europa, at sikkerheten er nesten ikke-eksisterende, og at barn kan utsættes for miltrettet markedsføring og skjult markedsføring. Forbrukerrådet anbefaler ikke docken til norske barn.

Simon Sommerfeldt, rådgiver og kommunikasjonsjef ved Bouvet, hacket dokken for Forbrukerrådet. Han forteller at utenforstående kan koble seg på dokken og snakke med barnet.

I studio kobler programleder seg på dokken. Der spiller hun av et oppakt gjennom dokken. Myrstad forteller dette viser hvor enkelt det gjøres. Samtidig er det like enkelt å lytte til det barnet sier og snakke direkte med barnet.

- Dette er alfor svak sikkerhet, uttaler Myrstad.

Sommerfeldt forteller at det finnes apparater som muliggjør sporing av dokkene.

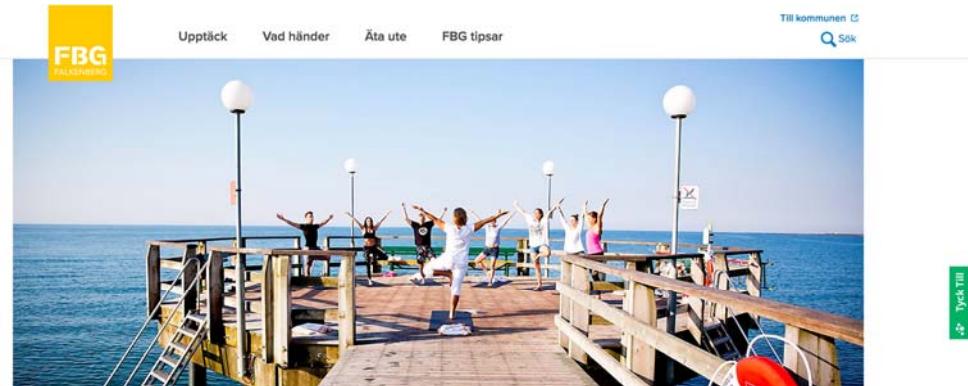

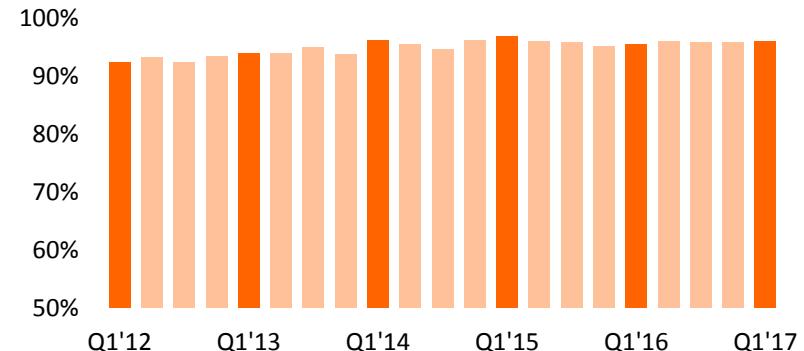

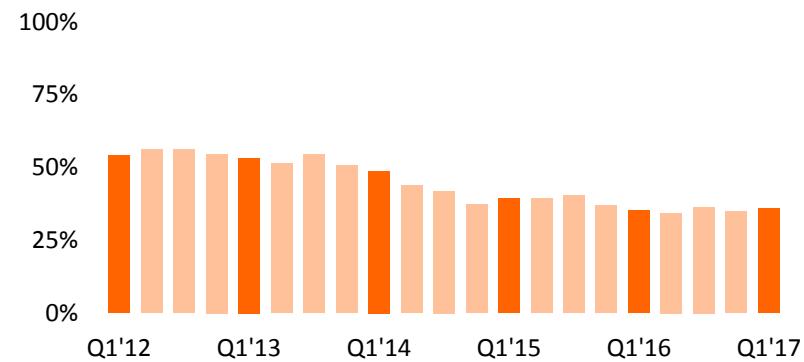
- Project mix

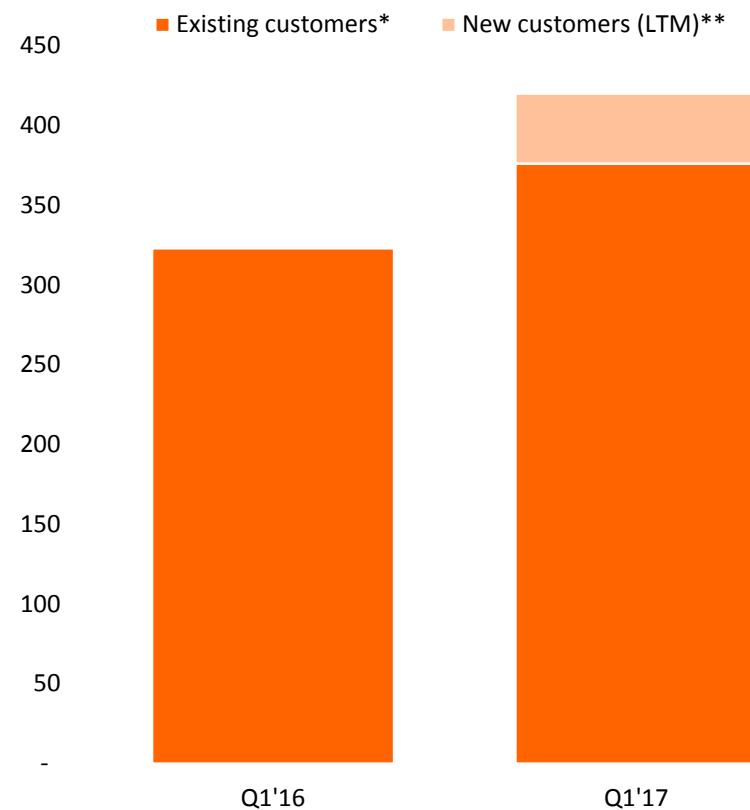

Revenue customer split

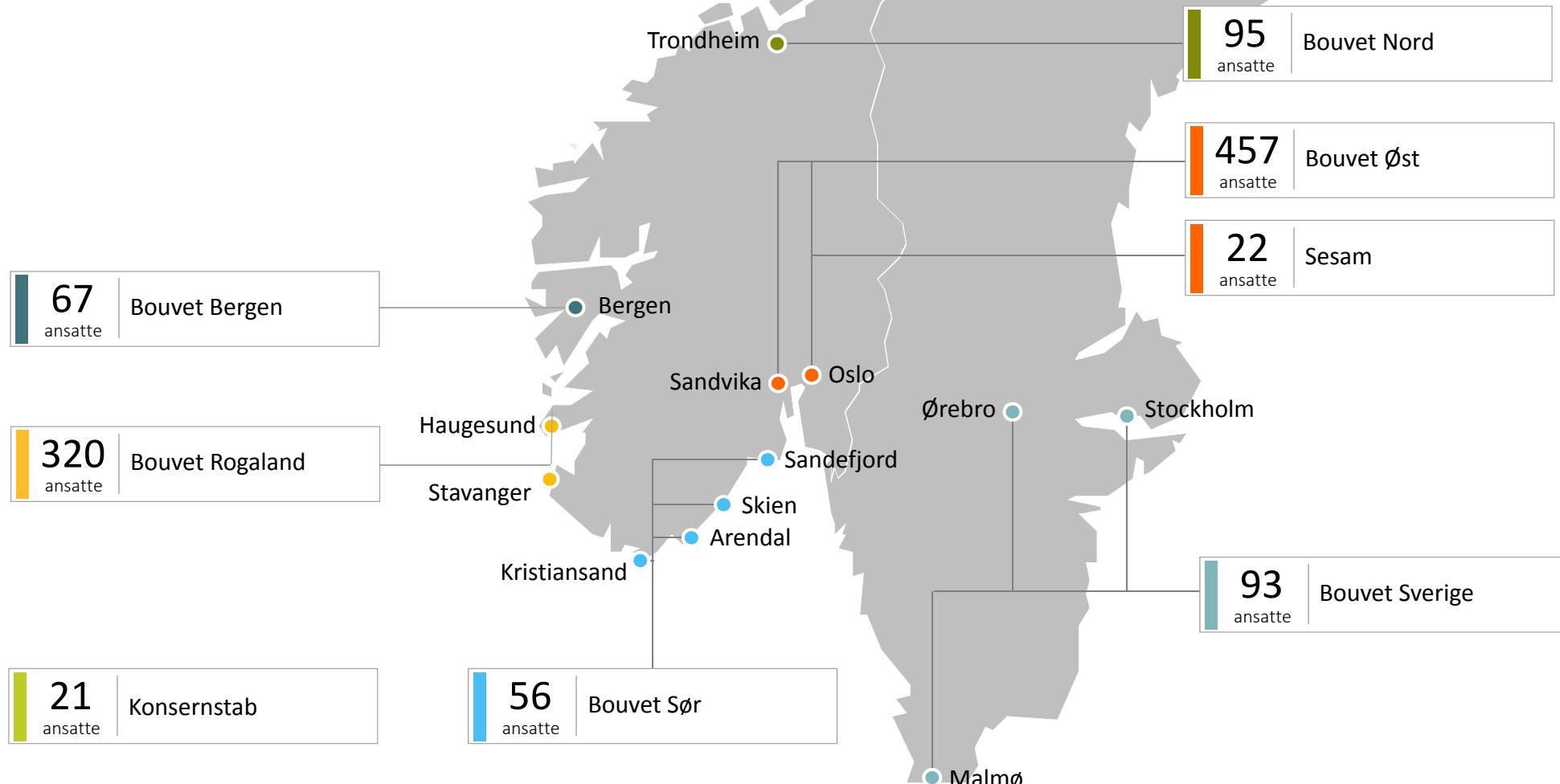

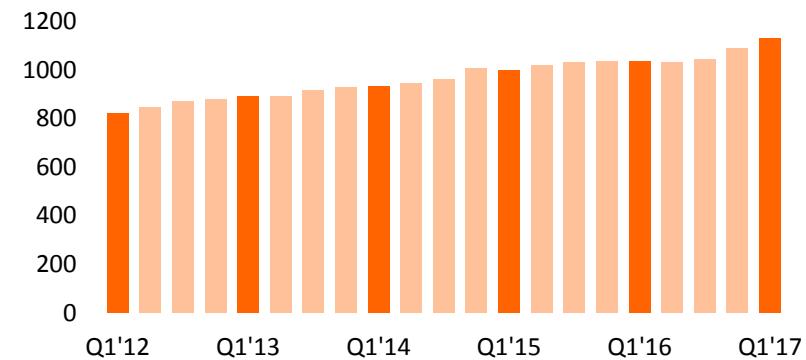

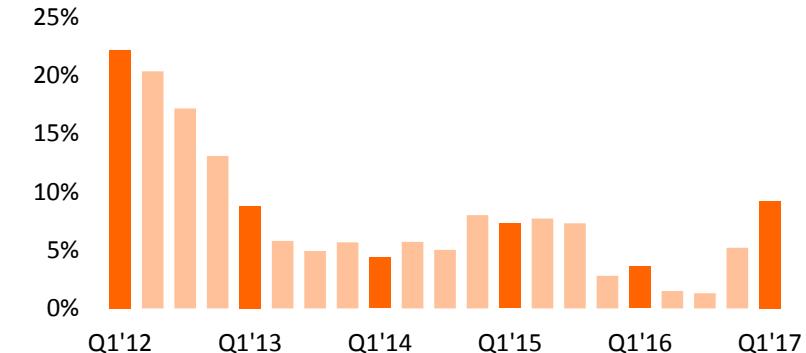

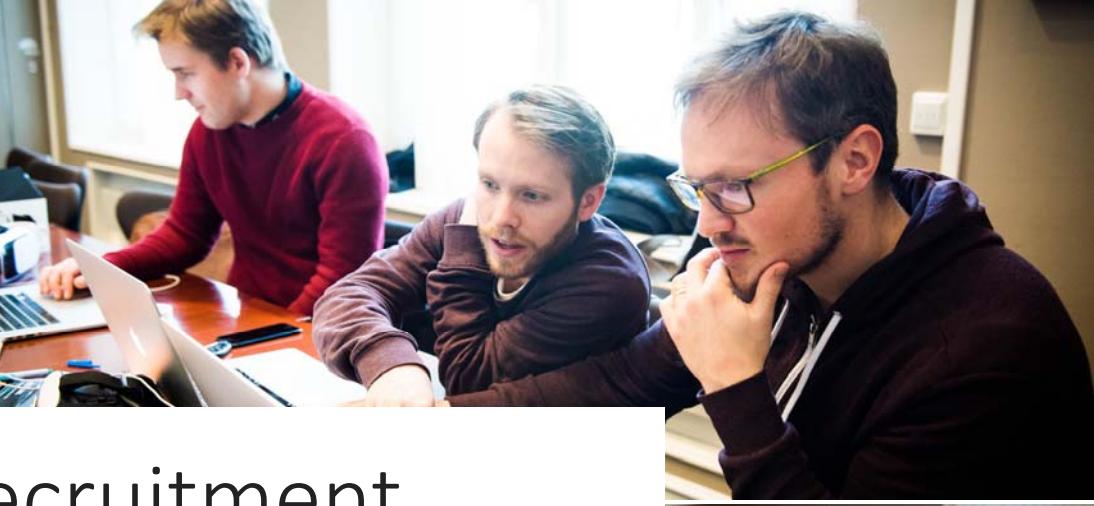

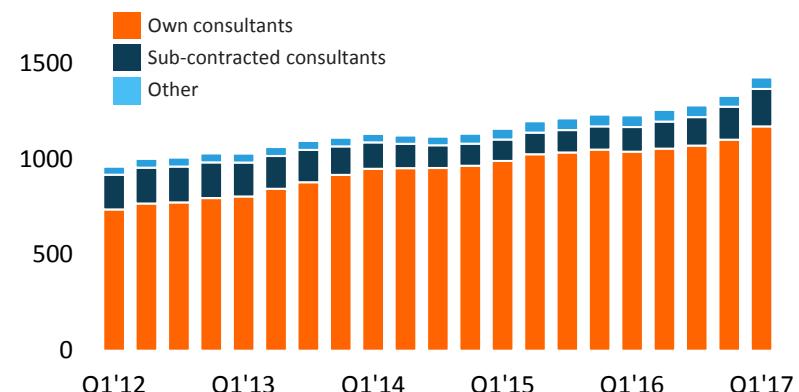
Revenue

- Revenues increased by 29.8 percent y-o-y
 - Revenues from own consultants increased by 25.5 percent to NOK 341.0 million
 - Revenues from sub-contracted consultants increased by 61.4 percent to NOK 61.5 million
 - Other revenues increased by 26.6 percent to NOK 16.5 million

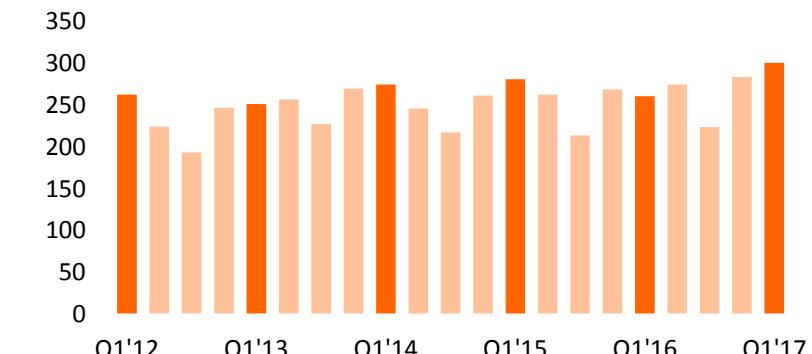


Revenues from own consultants

- Increased 25.5 percent y-o-y
 - Positive impact from increase in billing ratio by 2.4 percentage points
 - Positive impact from 8.1 percent increase in average number of employees
 - Positive impact from 1.5 percent increase in prices for group hourly services
 - 65 workdays in Q1'17 – four more than Q1'16

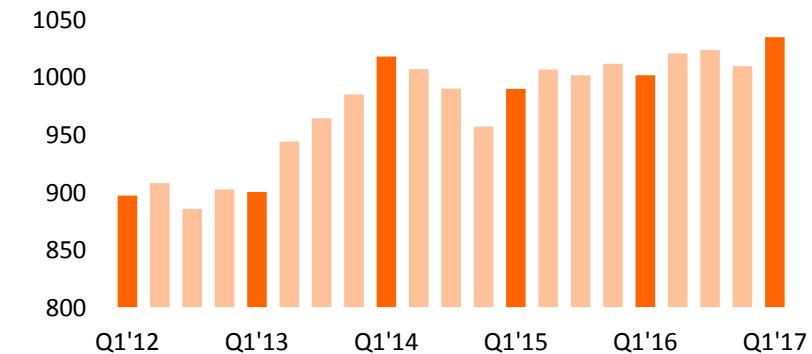
Revenue per employee (quarterly figures)

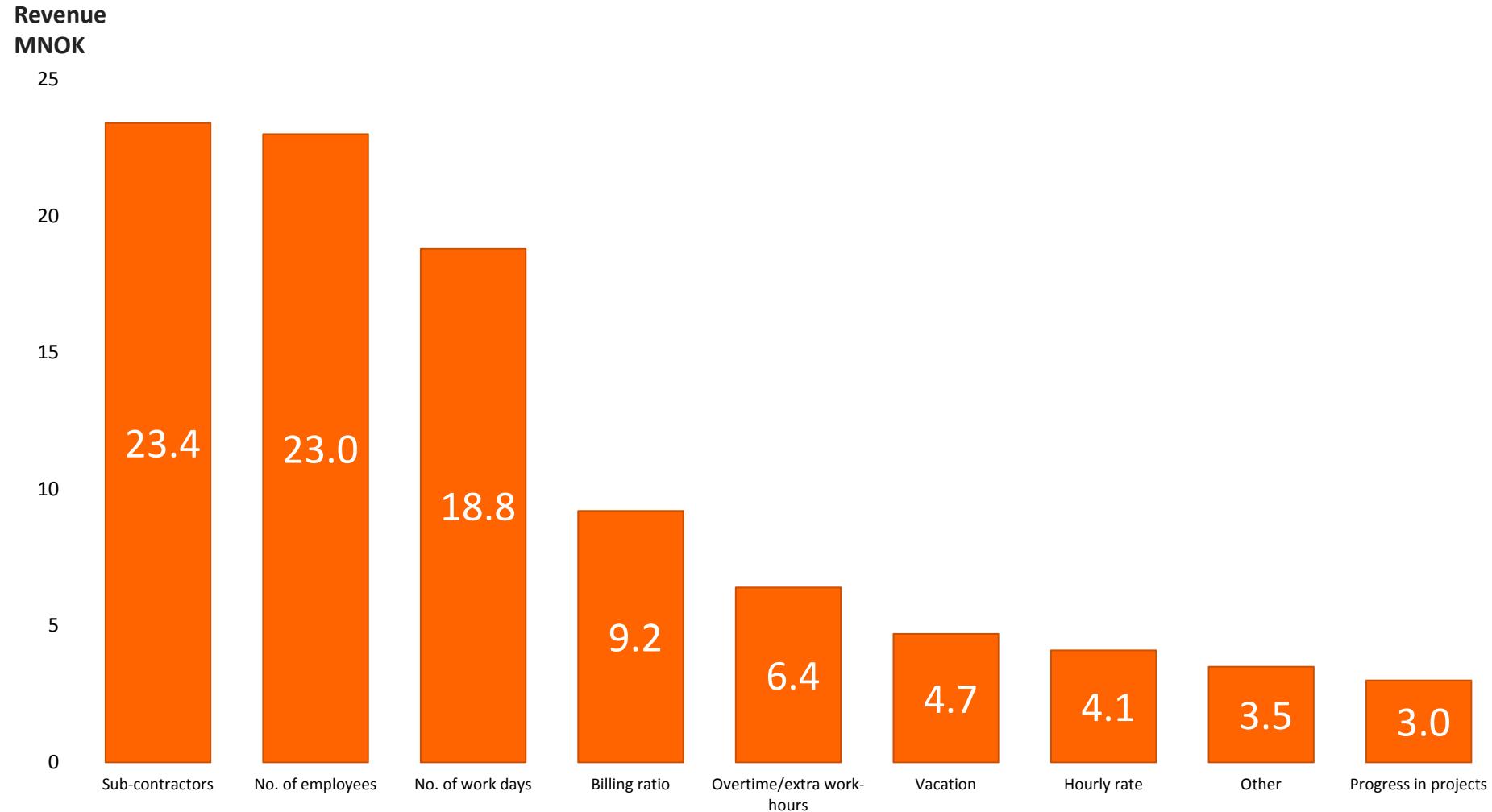


Revenue per employee (LTM)

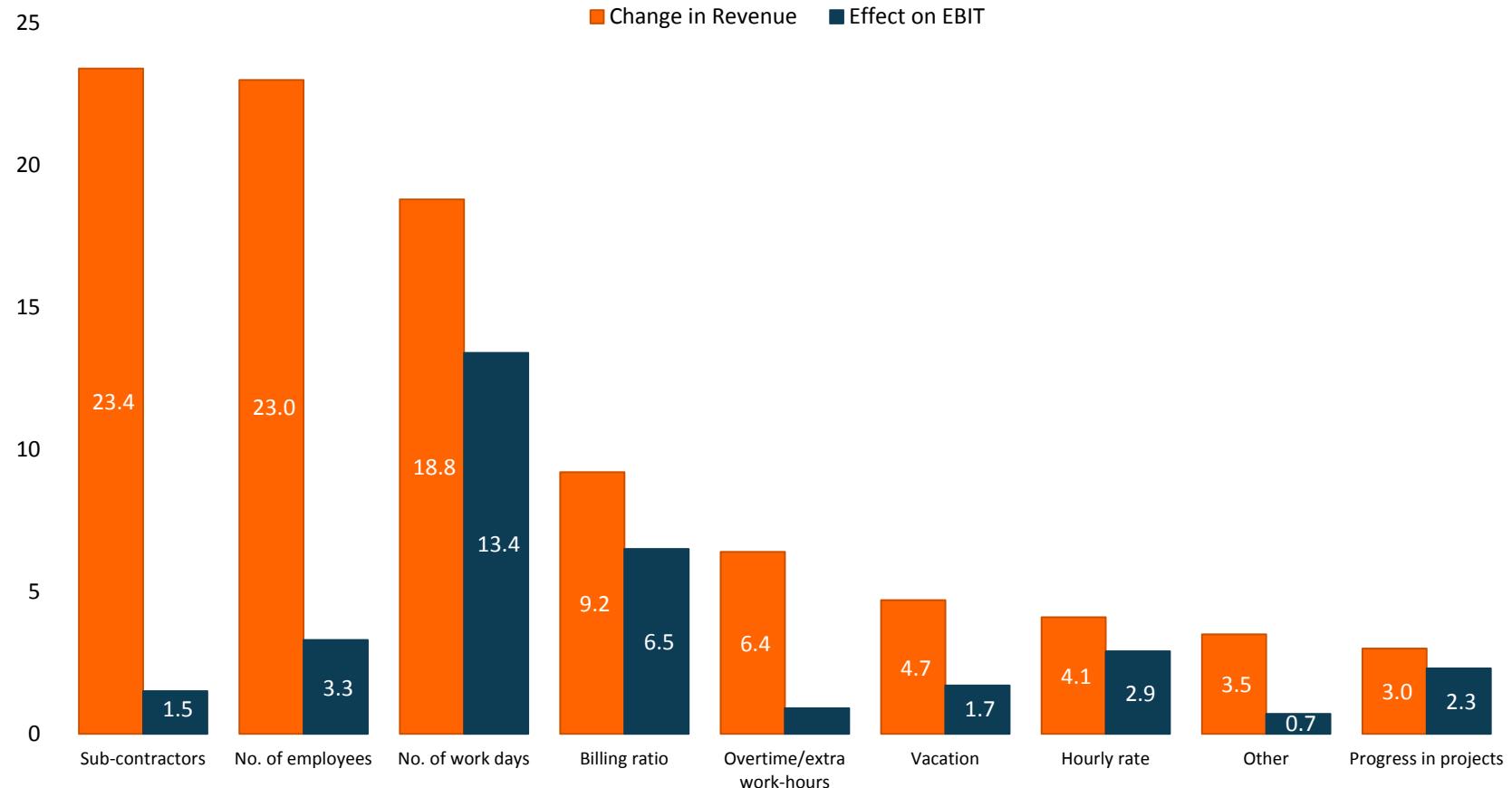


Analysis of change in revenues y-o-y

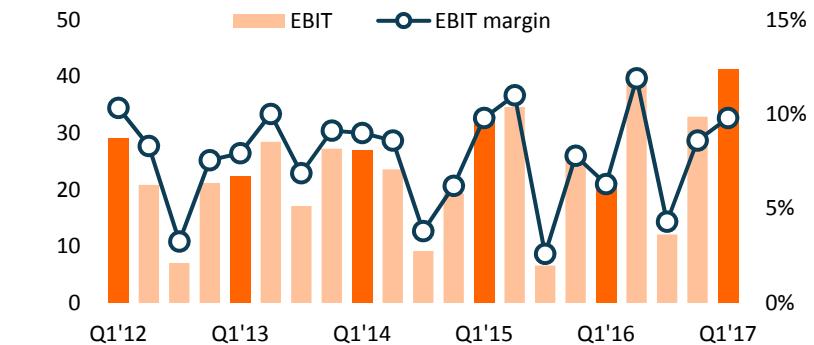


Earnings

- Operating profit increased y-o-y in Q1'17
 - EBIT margin of 9.8 percent compared to 6.3 percent in Q1'16
- Operating expenses increased by 24.9 percent compared to Q1'16
- General growth in pay rate 0.2 percent y-o-y
- Other operating expenses increased 37.3 percent

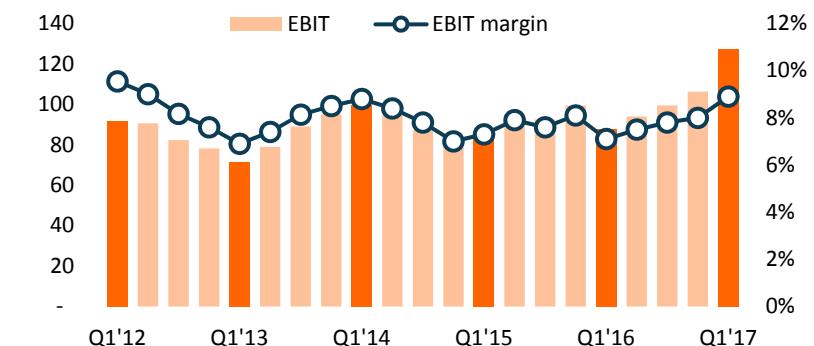
EBIT and EBIT margin

EBIT and EBIT margin (LTM)

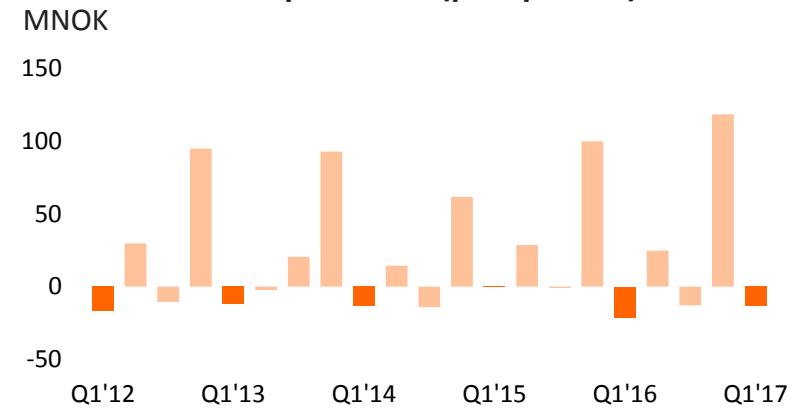

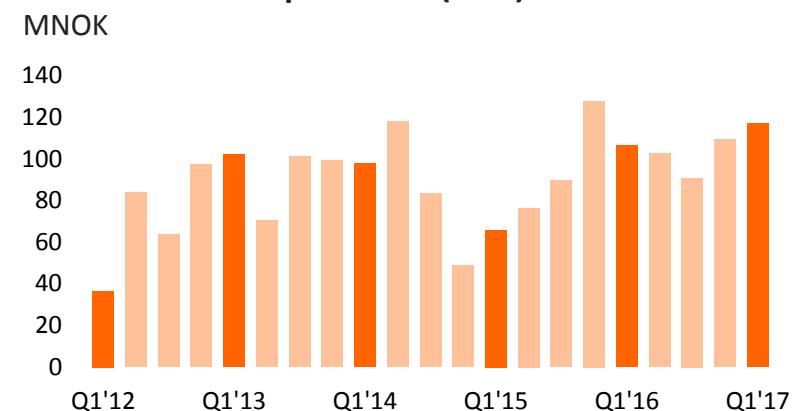
Cash flow

- Cash flow from operations
 - NOK -13.3 million in Q1'17 compared to NOK -21.1 million in Q1'16
- Last 12 months
 - Operational cash flow over the last 12 months was NOK 117.2 million

 - Negative NOK 12.0 million compared to negative NOK 5.0 million in Q1'16

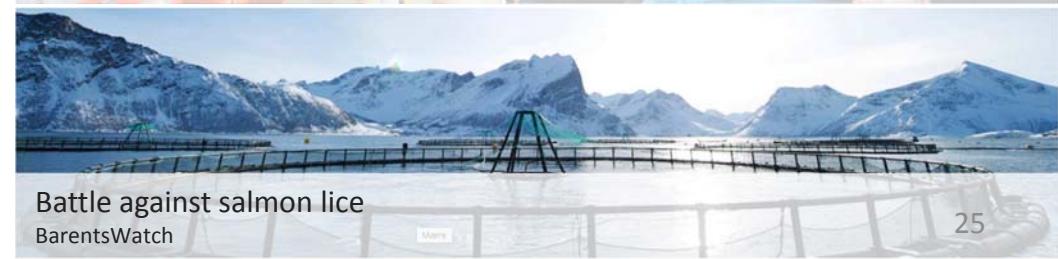
